ber up to five youngsters. If only two play, deal seven cards to each; if 4 or 5 play, deal 5 cards to each. The rest of the pack is put face down on the table, forming the stock.

The object of play is to form more "books" than any other player—a book being four of a kind, such as 4 Kings, 4 Queens, etc.

Play begins when the player at dealer's left says to some other player in the group, "Jimmy, give me your 4's." He must mention the name of the player he is speaking to, the exact rank of cards he wants (Aces, deuces, Queens, etc.) and he must hold in his hand at least one card of the rank he requests.

The player who is spoken to must hand over all the cards he has in the named rank, but if he has none, he says, "Go fish!" A player who is told to "go fish" must then draw the top card of the stock. The turn to ask for cards then passes to the player at his left.

If a player succeeds in getting some cards when he asks for them, he keeps his turn and may ask again. He may ask the same player or a different player, and he may ask for any rank in his new question.

Upon getting the fourth card of a "book," the player shows all four, places them on the table in front of him, and continues his turn.

The game ends when all thirteen books in the deck have been assembled. The winner is the player who holds the most books.
